100TH ANNIVERSARY OF PRESENT CHURCH BUILDING

On September 6, 1914, the present Halfway Creek Lutheran Church building was dedicated. The previous church building, which was located within the Halfway Creek Cemetery, was struck by lightning and burned to the ground on Easter morning in 1912. According to church records: "At a meeting of the Trus-

tees it was decided to select a new site for a church. The site selected was a hill on the corner of Abner Smith's farm in Sweden Coulee about a half mile southeast of the old church site. Abner Smith offered to sell this land for \$100 an acre and on February 26, rounding community. 1913 the Trustees decided to purchase an acre and the deal

was made for \$100. Here a fine gray brick veneer church with high steeple was built in 1913 and completed in 1914 at a cost of \$10,000." 100 years later, the church and high steeple continues to serve as a beacon to the sur-

A NOTE FROM OUR PARISH NURSES

SIMPLE WAYS TO ALLERGY-PROOF YOUR HOUSE

Protecting yourself from household allergens can be a daunting task, but start simple and you might see quick results.



Take off your shoes when you enter the house.

Vacuum carpets weekly using a vacuum with a small-particle filter.

Damp-mop floors once a week.

Wipe down surfaces with a damp cloth once a week.

Hang machine-washable curtains instead of heavy draperies.

Encase mattresses, box springs and pillows in dust-proof zippered covers.

Wash bedding in hot water once a week.

Repair cracked or broken caulk and tile in the bathroom.

Always run the bathroom exhaust fan when you take a shower.

Clean out under the kitchen sink and check for leaks.

Monitor the humidity in the air (ideal is 30-50 percent).

Change air filters once a month.

If you can only make a few changes, start with your bedroom - you spend about one-third of your time sleeping. And, if possible, go to an allergist and find out what you are allergic to. This will help you focus your efforts and make sure you are treating the right problem.

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 10½"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 2½" eraser
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Personal Care Kit:

- One light- to medium-weight, bath-size towel (approximately 52" X 27" or smaller), dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*
- One sturdy comb, remove packaging
- One metal nail clippers (with or without attached file), remove packaging

Baby Care Kit:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of gentle soap, in original wrapping
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins
