





VISION BOARD MEETING MINUTES FOR MARCH 2016

Present: David Gates, Rich Berger, James Bringe, Rick Jones, Joanne Nichols, Joe Noth, Jen Stangstalien & Pastor Janet

Dave Gates called the meeting to order at 6:34 pm

Pastor Wollam led us in devotion. Each member reflected on something that is affecting them. Pastor than led us in a moment of silence and a prayer.

Lee Anderson gave an update on the youth group and confirmation. 11 members of the youth will be going on the trip this summer to South Dakota. Mark Craig will be the male chaperone for the trip. Fundraising has gone well and enough has been raised to cover registration and the van rental so far. There are more upcoming fundraising events including a Pampered Chef fundraiser and Easter Breakfast. Confirmation will be on May 1st with 11 confirmands. The youth will also be participating in the Walk for Water at Valley View Mall on April 9th.

A motion was brought to approve the Interim Pastor contract for Pastor Janet Wollam for three-fourths (3/4) time by Rich Berger. The salary breakdown will be \$53,000 salary and \$6,781 housing allowance. This split was based on the three-quarters (3/4) allocation below which fits in the 2016 budget.
