PASTORNOTES

When the turkey and pie is finally pushed away and the hunters straggle in, the pumpkins and gourds and the signs of fall harvest and our abundant life are left for the squirrels, our world takes on a different shape and feel. The cycle of our land is quieter, the shape more spare, bare, dead. Grays and muted golds outline the world, not yet white.

For some the darkness is a comfort and draws us smiling to the cozy fire, or to the magical corner behind the lighted Christmas tree. For others there is worry in the air; worry from the darkness itself or worry from the need to heat, and to feed in these times, for separation, for peace. For the young it is just too long to wait for goodness and gifts, as the bride waits for her groom. The night becomes long, the longest of the winter, before the season shifts, sleepless hours extend.

It is in the depth of darkness that true hope emerges, whether it is the darkness of despair or just the longing for the dawn. That deep longing for what we cherish most: renewing health, relief from trying to do deeply difficult tasks, the sight and smell of a loved one, peace of mind, bombs' ceasing.

Be alert, those of long ago suggest. Pay attention to this leafless and spare canvas God has painted. Look up from twisting hands and tasks and endless shopping aisles. Bring the bare branch into focus. With your fingers trace and feel the tips of the grey quiet branch.

Feel the tip of the sleek bud that caps the stem. In the deadness we perceive, in the smallness of the world's care is abundance waiting, well wrapped against the cold and night, waiting for us to reach and touch and see the life, and promise, even now, when half spent in winter's night.

God's hope and longing reaching, shaping: a Word of dawn, a light. Small bud of Jesse's stem, in unlikely cold and straw, clothed in parent's worry. No temples or crowns.

Memory and longing, for a future meet here, and now: a saving grace, when half spent is our night.

Hope and Peace, which passes all understanding, be yours, and the world's this season.

NEWS AT HALFWAY CREEK—CONT. STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

Our Consecration Sunday Stewardship campaign was very successful. As of November 27:

- 1. 54 giving units completed an estimate of giving card on Consecration Sunday plus 12 were received afterwards for a total of 66 giving units completing estimate of giving cards.
- 2. A total of 42 of these giving units increased their financial commitment above their last year's amount.
- 3. A total of 47 giving units filled out estimate of giving cards and committed a total of \$119,482.
- 4. Based on last's year's giving records, we can expect to receive \$38,060 during the coming year from people who have consistent giving patterns during the past 12 months but were not present on Consecration Sunday.
- 5. Based on the average total of loose offerings during the past three years, we can expect to receive \$4290 during the coming year from that source.
- 6. Church income from non-donor sources such as interest and fees is projected to be \$5125.
- 7. This gives us a grand total of \$166,958 anticipated income for the next twelve months.
- 8. The total income for our general operating budget during the last 12 months was \$126,550.
- 9. Next year, we can expect our operating budget income to increase by \$40,408. That is very good news as we continue to pay the mortgage on our addition.
- 10. This is a 32% increase in total giving above last year. WOW!!!
- 11. We served approximately 125 guests at our celebration meal. Thank you to L & M Catering of Melrose for their delicious meal.

We are still receiving estimate of giving cards in the office from members who were not able to attend Consecration Sunday. Final results will be included in the January annual report.

CONGREGATIONAL CONVERSATION: GENDER, CLERGY, AND MARRIAGE

In October, your Vision Board set aside a Sunday afternoon to prayerfully share their experiences and thoughts on issues of gender diversity. This issue relates to those clergy from which the call committee chooses to receive profiles. In addition, because same sex marriage is now legal in Wisconsin, clergy called to this congregation would need to know the congregation's position on blessing and/or marrying same gender couples.

Following conversation at two regularly scheduled meetings, the Vision Board would like to involve the congregation in this conversation in two ways. First, they will sponsor two opportunities, one in December and one in January for the same kind of prayerful sharing that they engaged in during October. This would involve prayer, a circle conversation, and the opportunity to both speak and/or listen to others. Educational and informational materials from the ELCA will also be made available.

Second, there will be an opportunity to express comfort level and preferences on a spectrum in a brief written survey. This survey will be conducted on two Sundays in January, at church. The survey will be a bulletin insert, to be completed and deposited on the same day. Surveys will be available, before, during, and after services.

The conversation will then be returned to the Vision Board for their consideration.

The Vision Board invites all confirmed members of the congregation to participate in this chance to hear from one another in a safe and respectful environment.
