The board discussed LGBTQ questions and scheduling of congregational conversation sessions.

We closed with the Lord's prayer. Bob Bandoli made a motion to adjourn. Rick Jones seconded. Meeting adjourned.

CONGREGATIONAL CONVERSATION: GENDER, CLERGY, AND MARRIAGE

In October, your Vision Board set aside a Sunday afternoon to prayerfully share their experiences and thoughts on issues of gender diversity. This issue relates to those clergy from which the call committee chooses to receive profiles. In addition, because same sex marriage is now legal in Wisconsin, clergy called to this congregation would need to know the congregation's position on blessing and/or marrying same gender couples.

Following conversation at two Vision Board meetings, the Vision Board would like to involve the congregation in this conversation in two ways:

First, they will sponsor an opportunity in January for the same kind of prayerful sharing that they engaged in during October. This would involve prayer, a circle conversation, and the opportunity to both speak and/or listen to others. Educational and informational materials from the ELCA will also be made available.

Second, there will be an opportunity to express comfort level and preferences on a spectrum in a brief written survey. This survey will be conducted on two Sundays in January, at church. The survey will be a bulletin insert, to be completed and deposited on the same day. Surveys will be available, before, during, and after services.

The conversation will then be returned to the Vision Board for their consideration.

The Vision Board invites all confirmed members of the congregation to participate in this chance to hear from one another in a safe and respectful environment.

A NEW WAY TO NOMINATE VISION BOARD MEMBERS

How do you feel yourself to be called to faithful participation in your congregation? Do you find fellowship and meaningful outreach in engineering a quilt? Do you like spending time with children, teens, or young adults, because they give you energy and a different take on God's world? Do you like to putter with plants or repair things, or make sure someone does? Do you want more input into worship, Bible study, or a time for prayer? In church that is God calling to you, just as God calls you outside our churchy walls and time.

So it is with Vision Board membership. We feel call to discern, to try to see and figure out God's hopes and challenges for us now and for our future. Sometimes we see ourselves doing this, maybe, and sometimes others see that potential in us. This year our nomination process will make room for both our personal calling and the congregation's sense of who would be faithful members.

How it will work:

January 8 & January 15, in each congregation, we will have a nomination process within the worship service. Everyone present will be invited to nominate one person they believe would be a good and faithful Vision Board member. You can nominate yourself, and if you are unable to attend either of those Sundays, you may ask someone else to enter the name of an individual for you. Nominations will then be closed for the year. The process includes many more people and frames our decision in the language of faithful response to God's call.

Every person nominated will receive a packet of information and be asked to pray and think about their gifts and how they might fit with Vision Board, and with their lives at this time. They will also be invited to a Vision Board meeting in January as an introduction to our process, if they wish to come. A form in the packet will allow every person to accept or decline nomination. The form will be returned to the office by Friday, January 20th. Those who accept the nomination by the deadline will be placed on the nominee ballot. We have openings for 3 to 5 members.

During the worship service on January 29, those present will choose by written ballot, our Vision Board nominees for 2017. The top vote receivers will be your 2017 Vision Board slate of nominees.

Vision Board will be elected by written ballot at the annual meeting on February 5th. Vision Board officers will then be chosen at the first Vision Board 2017 meeting; following annual meeting.

The value of this method is that it builds a sense of the whole church, encourages a confidence shared between membership and leaders, and encourages conversation and self-reflection. Over several years it builds trust and participation.

SO, what do we do now? WE ALL pray for guidance, maybe as we look through the directory. We ask ourselves who we know to be a great listener, whether or not they always share our point of view. We explore the various age groups, including high school students, folks in their 20's and 30's as well as faithful and wise members of long standing. We ask others what they have discovered in their prayer and consideration. We ask "why not", or is there some attitude of our own that is not seeing gifts. We think about open minds and open hearts, that will work to hear God's Word for the years ahead.

Stephen Ministry

Once more the "rush" of the Christmas Season is past and we head into the cold and sometimes dreary month of January. As Christians our hope and faith has been renewed as we celebrated the birth of Jesus. But even Christians face difficult times. For some it may mean the loss of a loved one through death or divorce. Others may be experiencing the loss of a job. Some may be trying to cope with injuries suffered from an accident; others may be dealing with a devastating illness. There are so many people hurting in our church family and community. They find the burden they are dealing with too great to carry alone and are in need of someone who will listen and understand their fears and heartaches.

That is where Stephen Ministry comes in. Stephen Ministers are lay people who are trained to listen with caring and loving hearts and to walk beside those who are suffering, sharing in their grief and pain. They do this in complete confidentiality. If you or someone you know needs a Stephen Minister, please call a pastor who will relay that need to the Stephen Ministry Leaders.

We are also looking for people who are interested in taking the Stephen Ministry training. If you are thinking about it, but are unsure, we will be happy to talk to you about the program. We need six or more people who are interested in the training before we can begin. If you would like to reach out to others with Christ- centered love and caring... we need you! Please talk with one of the pastors and/or Stephen Leaders if you would like to learn more.


