#### LETTER FROM SISTER BECKY

Dear friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God our creator and our Savior, Jesus Christ!

One of my guiding principles in my ministry so far - both in and out of a parish setting - has been that worship is the center of our life together.

The distinguishing mark of a congregation is not that we are active in serving others (although we are absolutely called to do that) or that we are vocal advocates for the needs and well-being of the "least of these" among us (and we are absolutely called to do that!). The distinguishing mark of a congregation is that we are called and gathered around Word and Sacraments where God Ives and nourishes us and sends us out in service to the world.

February gives us more opportunities to gather to pray, praise, and lament to God together in worship because it marks the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 14!

Lent is one of those seasons of the year that isn't always clearly understood by Christians (much less the rest of the world.) Lent is one of the oldest practices of the church and while the practice has changed over the centuries and varies between denominations, the marks that Lutheran usually observe are a focus on the spiritual practices of prayer, generosity, and fasting.

Fasting is probably the one that gets the most "press" with it commonly being the season where we talk about "give something up." Too often that "giving up" practice can feel like another shot at New Years' resolutions. Giving up caffeine, or beer, or chocolate for the season. A church-based self improvement plan.

But fasting is better understood not as a deprivation practice, but as a setting aside one thing so that our time and attention can focus on prayer, God's word, and service.

All that being said, whatever spiritual practices you decide to pick up (or lay down) during this season, we will have more opportunity to be together to worship God during Lent. We will gather on Sundays, AND on Wednesday evenings to hear God's word, pray, sing, and learn together.

After Ash Wednesday (2/14), the rest of the Wednesdays through February and March, we will gather around a simple supper beginning around 5:30 (come when you can!) At 6:15 we'll turn our attention around the supper table to a simple Lenten prayer service. At 6:45, we'll disperse to book study, or worship team rehearsal, or a trip home. (See other articles in this newsletter for details about Wednesday Lenten worship and the book study.)

I pray that you will be with us for these times of worship, prayer, learning, and fellowship this season. And I encourage you to invite others who are are hungry in body and spirit to **come and see** who Christ is and who we are in Christ.

#### LENTEN BOOK STUDY

Have you ever wondered, "What's up with the cross? What's the big deal with that? Why did Jesus have to die?"

If you have, you're not alone! While the cross is at the center of the Christian faith, not very many of us understand how or why. How does a loving God square with the violence of the cross? Is it about sin? About love? About forgiveness? Passion and sacrifice? What's this business about "taking up your cross?"

These are all good, important questions that we are sometimes afraid to ask. Sometimes Christians shy away from the central questions because they seem too complicated or come with two thousand years of arguments behind them.

David Lose's book "Making Sense of the Cross" is written as a conversation between two friends; one asking and the other trying to answer serious questions about the cross and it's meaning for our lives in the 21st century.

The five sessions will talk us through the different ways Christians have explained the cross over the centuries.

One word of caution: if you're looking for the one and only way of understanding the cross, you will be disappointed. However, with the help of the Holy Spirit I believe this conversation will deepen your faith as we read and explore together the heart of our Christian faith that is revealed in the cross and resurrection of Jesus.

Each session will be offered on Sunday during the education hour and repeated the following Wednesday evening after worship. Signup on the bulletin board or by calling the office. Books are \$13 each and will be ordered on Feb 5. The book is also available on Kindle.
