## Dear La Crosse Area Women of the ELCA

Happy April to all the women of the La Crosse Area Women of the ELCA!

I write this greeting on a blustery February day with temps finally above freezing. Looking forward to an end to the worst of winter in Wisconsin. But, “these days are the Lord’s doing. Rejoice and be glad in it.” (Psalm 23 and 24). Every new day presents opportunities to rejoice with thanksgiving!

The past week kept me busy with a board meeting on Tuesday and President’s Conference via zoom Thursday, Friday and Saturday. So as I sift through notes from both events, I bring you the latest “news.”

First, from the La Crosse Area Women of the ELCA board meeting. As we arrived at the synod office annex for our meeting, we admired a quilt that had been displayed at the synods WELCA constituting convention in 1989. Embroidered or fabric painted quilt blocks representative of congregations in the synod surrounds the Lily Pad logo in the center. Look for a picture elsewhere in the newsletter.

The important issues addressed, both related to the Covid pandemic. From a previous meeting of the board it was necessary to approve a revised budget. Now, the hard part ..... at this February 16<sup>th</sup> meeting our treasurer shared a giving report indicating that many units have not sent any offerings since the pandemic began almost one year ago. We realize that many circles and units are not meeting, but we also need to continue supporting our synod who in turn supports the churchwide expression.

We learned at the weekend conference that churchwide has severely cut their budget with the biggest cut in staff from 10 full time staff to 8 half time. The only continuing full time positions are the editor of the Gather magazine and the Executive Director, Linda Bushkofsky. At this time, as things are, churchwide can continue through August with their current revised budget. I am suggesting that if your unit budgeted an offering for our convention (that was cancelled) that you still send it on to Mona as that would boost our synod treasury plus sending the required half to churchwide. Some units have already done this,

Now, to the exciting board meeting decision. At this point in time, we are looking to have an outdoor convention on Saturday, July 31<sup>st</sup> at the park in Cashton, hosted by Trinity Lutheran, hosts of the cancelled 2020 convention. More details will be forthcoming as plans are worked out. In 2022, plans are to meet at Our Savior’s in La Crosse on April 16<sup>th</sup>, our customary Saturday date.

Know that I pray for all of you; that, you, my friends are staying connected, continuing Bible study however possible, enjoying the Gather magazine or other readings, and checking in with each other. Looking forward to a “new” convention!

Wishing you blessings as we navigate this ongoing pandemic.  
We have Christ Jesus walking with us. “Rejoice and be glad...”

As we celebrate our history, how are we living into God's call for our future?



**As a community of women created in the image of God, called into discipleship in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to grow in faith, affirm our gifts, support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the church, the community and the world.**

### **Can we bend? Can we forgive?**

We are living with several generations now. Women in their 90's, who remember horses on the farm, and women who have used computers all their life. All are looking at our mission statement. All wanting to support and be supported as they see fit. That 'fit' may not be the same for all of us. To make our synod, our units reflect our missions we all need to Bend and Forgive simultaneously. All of us need to be cognizant that there are generational differences and we must accept and work together. We need each other. How much do we have to bend? As much as you need to, sometime you might feel like a contortionist. How much do I have to forgive? Continually.

Our mission statement, what the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America will do, was written in 1988. It was written in such a way it will reflect the women of any generation moved by the Holy Spirit.

The La Crosse Area Synod of the Women of the ELCA did not have a convention in 2020. The women who were due to go off of the Board agreed to stay on and continue to share their gifts. Before I go any further, **Thank you ladies!** You are awesome.

It is time to move on. We have a plan, and we pray you will see the beauty of it. Almost all of our officers are going to be elected this year. Some will have a real short term (our next convention will be in April of 2022). Some will have a little longer. So, you ask what are the jobs and they do they do? A very good question. I am going to give you a very brief description of the job of each board member. Please read them, pray and consider using your gifts in new way.

First here are some basics, all board members and officers (who also are Board Members) must be a member of a unit in the territory of the La Crosse Area Synod and a member of the ELCA. All board members must come from different units, except for the Board-member-at-large (she could be in another board members' unit).

The **President** presides over the conventions, board meetings and Administrative Committee meetings. She submits a report of her activities at each regular convention. She is a liaison to Churchwide women's organization, and is on or appoints a representative to Inter-Lutheran and Ecumenical associations and to the La Crosse Synod Council. Two year term 2021-2023.

The **Vice President** acts in the absence, disability or resignation of the president until the position is filled by the board or next scheduled meeting. She performs such other duties requested by the President or Board. One-half year term from 2021-2022.

The **Secretary** acts as such to the board and Admin Committee of the Synodical Board. She is responsible for recording and distributing minutes of the Synodical convention, the Board and the Admin Committee. She will give notification of a regular convention at least three months



prior to and special convention one month prior to. She will keep a correct register of the roll call of congregational units along with the names of officers of the units. She will secure from the units such reports as required and perform other duties the board may direct. She will provide for gathering and preserving historical records and documents. Two year term 2021-2023.

The **Treasurer** will provide for keeping of all records and accountable for all funds. She will be responsible for disbursing funds in accordance with financial policies of the Women of the ELCA and budget of the synodical women's organization. She will present a complete report, including audit to Synodical Women's Convention and interim reports to each Board and Amin Committee meeting. One-half year term from 2021-2022.

**Conference Rep Board members** There are five board members elected by convention to the board. Each for a two year term, four board members shall be elected, each to represent a conference of the La Crosse Area Synod: East, South, West and North. One, Board-Member-at-large can come from any of the four conferences. At this time: Two year term 2021-2023 North and South; One year term for East, West and Member-at-large 2021-2022.

**Board members** shall transact necessary business and programs and decisions between conventions, set policies when required, and supervise all committees. They will determine time and place of convention, prepare agenda, and rules and program for Convention.

**Board member-at-large** duty beyond the above items, is to collect data from the units pertaining to what they present to LWR, and report results to convention.

Using the Quilt and Kit Tracker, we know that the quilts donated by Trinity Lutheran Church in  
Sparta went the country of Lebanon. From the LWR website, we can learn more about the work  
LWR is doing in Lebanon. Lebanon is the home to the largest number of Syrian refugees. LWR is  
training refugee and very poor Lebanese families in agricultural skills, including irrigation and  
utilizing greenhouses to provide crops both for income and for food security.

Lebanon is also experiencing an economic crisis in addition to the challenges related to the Covid-  
19 pandemic. The country is facing a nation debt 150% of their GDP. The Lebanese pound has lost  
85% of its value, causing the banking system to collapse. Lebanon also faces one of the largest gen-  
der gaps in the world. Only 1 out of 4 women are employed, as opposed to 3 out of 4 men. Only 3  
percent of bank loans go to women.

In Lebanon, LWR is working with USAID to boost the resilience and capabilities of Lebanese  
women entrepreneurs and to improve the environment for women's entrepreneurship by providing  
microfinance and social lending alternative to the nation's banking system.

LWR is also providing training in conflict resolution and prevention and is working with the Biden  
administration to advocate for fairer labor laws, especially preventing sexual harassment and for  
maternity leave.

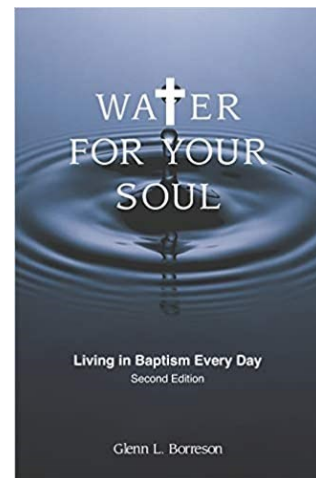
### Choices

Cleva's writings provide a glimpse into how she saw the world, most often with awe for creation, abiding faith, and love for family. Her imagination had no bounds!
