The Lutheran Campus Ministry at Common Ground website proclaims who we are in these words: Lutheran Campus Ministry is a Campus Ministry in La Crosse that is open, affirming, hopeful, and embracing of all faith journeys. We are unashamedly followers of Christ. Similarly, like Christ, we strive to be inquisitive, friendly to all, and inviting of creative conversation to express thoughts and opinions, fostering understanding before landing on anything like a definitive answer.

Why do we need common ground?

The world around us makes us want to choose. Choose between our mind or our heart. Choose between faith or reason. Choose between insiders and outsiders. Choose between us or them.

So here in La Crosse, where the bluffs meet the river, there is a place where you, all of you — your hopes, fears, wonder, doubts, joys, and dreams are welcome.

This year, LCM is adapting to fulfill our shared mission and meet student needs in creative and resilient ways:

- Sunday worship is online this year and includes quite a few students who are new to LCM at Common Ground.
- Pop-up Church: Once a week, Pastor Ben sets the altar, font, and some chairs outside. Students are invited to receive communion, a blessing, prayer, and an open ear.
- Chili and: a weekly option to share a socially distanced meal outside and discuss a different theme.
- Pastoral counseling and conversation meets students where they are in a year of high anxiety and stress.
- Quarantine Gummy Bears: at any given moment a sizable number o four students are in quarantine. When it happens we drop off a big bag of gummy bears for them. 14 days is a long time to be isolated, and they provide a tangible sign of our community's love. And really, who does not want to answer a knock on the door and find a big bag of happy?

We invite you to pray with us as Pastor Ben, music interns, the social media intern, and student leaders as we continue to fulfill mission for spiritual formation, community-building, and social justice while adapting to the challenges of the times.

Rising From the Ashes:

An Update on Quilts and Kits Caught in the Beirut Explosion

The news and evolving reports out of Beirut following the deadly explosion of August 4 has had many of our heads whirling in the last couple months. As many of you know, three containers of quilts and kits were in the port awaiting customs clearance on the day of the blast. Immediate reports from the port authority indicated that the containers could not have survived.

A fourth container had been separated at the port in the United States and was still on the water at the time of the explosion. It was rerouted to the port in Tripoli.

As we joined with many of you in our shared lament, we were deeply inspired and humbled by your determination to keep going, keep creating, keep serving, keep sharing your love with our neighbors all over the world.

On the morning of August 26, we received an urgent update from our partner, Anera: they had been given access to the port, and against all odds, the containers were intact! Following this incredible news, LWR staff held our breath until the quilts and kits could be assessed for damage.

Finally, we learned on September 22 that, despite the magnitude of the blast, the seal of the containers containing the LWR Mission Quilts and Kits was not broken. The placement in the port, inside a concrete storage building and surrounded by other shipping containers, protected the containers enough to even prevent chemical contamination.

As we awaited this last piece of information, the fourth container cleared customs in Tripoli and travelled over land to join the other three in Anera's Beirut warehouse, once again bringing the full shipment together.

We give thanks to God that the love of hundreds of Lutheran congregations contained in this shipment will be able to be shared with more than 24,000 of our neighbors in Beirut and across the country of Lebanon — many refugees from across the region, and now also those affected by the blast in the heart of Beirut. From the ashes of this crisis rises a beautiful ray of hope: your love, intact and powerful, in just the right place, at just the right time.

"Dear Friend in Christ, a letter-exchange project, has proven so popular that it's been extended to March 5, 2021," said Linda Post Bushkofsky, executive director. "Women throughout the ELCA have written letters, sharing their faith, offering advice on coping through the pandemic, even exchanging poems and recipes."

"The project's success coupled with the most challenging days ahead in the coronavirus pandemic suggested we should extend Dear Friend in Christ into the new year," she explained. "Maintaining community through Thanksgiving, Christmas, and into the New Year — all at a time of physically distancing — is critically important."

We encourage women who have participated in the project to exchange Christmas cards, she said. And you can continue to sustain community and lift spirits into 2021. Those who are new to the project are invited to do the same.

It's easy to participate in the Dear Friend in Christ project. You write a letter, complete the release form, and mail it to the address provided on the form. Soon thereafter, you will receive a letter, and the author of that letter will receive your letter.

Don't forget the release form! That explains why some women have sent in letters but not received any in return. The project requires a signed release form. If a woman knows she did not include a release form, she can complete one and mail it in so that an exchange can occur.
