Worship and Programming

As we begin a fall of worship and programing, it is important to remember why we gather as we do. Our mission is to Reach Out and Share Christ With All. In our worship, fellowship, and education that starts with creating environments where God's love for us and for our most vulnerable neighbors is strongly communicated. For us, that means creating spaces in worship and programing that are safe for anyone to gather when other spaces around us may not be so. It also means reaching out in new and creative ways to those who are not gathering in-person with us (and we will continue improving our methods of doing this).

As we continue forward together, let us do so with innovation, creativity, grace, and compassion. Let us be Christ's gathered and sent body at work in the world. Let us find creative ways of being church together safely, effectively, and for the sake of our neighbors.

Why we mask at HCLC:

We mask, first and foremost, to care for our neighbor.

Masking, along with physical distancing, is the easiest universal practice we can do to prevent unknowingly spreading disease to others. It also is moderately effective at protecting oneself. We long to gather normally with many people we haven't seen for a while as well as new people we've not yet met. But some of those people are not ready to take more risks among us than they already take each day as they go to work, play, or school. And others, while they are willing, we'd rather protect.

So to be as welcoming as possible, we continue our easiest and best practices for preventing disease by masking for indoor programming and worship. We also recommend masking even outdoors, if adequate distancing is not kept.

We mask to show love for our neighbor.

There are those among us who have not yet had a chance to be vaccinated, or cannot be vaccinated.

And while we know that current mutations of the coro-


na virus has made spreading even by vaccinated people common, vaccination still greatly reduces severity of the disease. For those of us who are able to receive the vaccine, we continue to wear masks for the safety of those who cannot, and in solidarity with those who need either the protection or piece of mind of masks.

La Crosse county this fall has been maintaining its status of "high" community spread for coronavirus. While the summer gave us great hope that things were moving in the right direction, we must now remember that this is not over. That can be hard when the threat is one that is able to be invisible to many. It takes listening to others and discipline to remind ourselves why we do this, when we can't see with our own eyes what's going on.

What if I can't mask?

If you, in genuine faith and love, long to join the inperson activities of HCLC but are unable to wear a mask, please know first that you are loved and valued by this community. Talk to Pastor Chris, stay in contact and relationship with us. We are church together for the sake of the world, and we will learn how best to do that during times such as this.

Amazing Improvements

Lutefisk Shed

There is a small shed in the back of our church. It has had many uses since it was constructed. In 1974 Alfred and Margaret Bringe donated a tin shed for cooking lutefisk for HCLC annual Lutefisk & Lefsa Supper.



But even placing that shed down wind from the church could not keep the fish smell from coming into church. That shed was moved to the back of the building and a driveway was constructed around the church building. After Lester Nelson died in 1986, his wife, Francis Nelson, donated monies from her husband's estate for materials to construct a permanent building. This building has come to be called The Lutefisk Shed. Church members donated their labor.





The shed has had many uses, from making flatbread and lefsa for the annual HCLC Fall Bazaar to its use as a meeting place for HCLC Youth Group. The griddles and peeler have been sold. The Lutefisk shed has a new garage door and will soon have new siding and facia boards. It is used for storage.



Whispering Pines

Whispering Pines HCLC Outdoor Worship Area was the brainchild of Russell Bringe and Pastor Carol Garmen in 1990.

In 1990 Chad Waldenberger helped with construction as his Eagle Scout project under Russ's supervision. In 1998 the benches were rebuilt by Ryan Beville under the direction of Ed Scholze as Ryan's Eagle Scout project. The Altar was built by Roy Ackermann and he dedicated the upper seating area to his wife Gloria. Gloria died in 2000.



Ramp

The handicap access ramp to the back of the church was added in 1989. Materials have been purchased to rebuild the railings on the ramp. No date is set for this project.



Road Sign

The road sign built by Orin Nyseth, Archie Achterkirch, Bill Achterskirch and Ed Scholze was dedicated August 28, 1988. The sign is in need of new plexiglass.



Parsonage

The parsonage received a new roof this summer. Our 35 year old house (built in 1986) received new flooring this year.


