Welcome to the season of Lent.

Are you all familiar with the traditions of Lent in the Christian church?

Lent is typically the time of year when we think about deepening our faith, learning a new spiritual practice, taking part in Bible study, or increasing in our generosity. That has a lot to do with the ancient practice of catechesis.

People new to the faith, before being fully welcomed into the community, would undergo catechesis - a lot like Confirmation today. They would learn about Jesus, learn what it means to be a part of the family or body of Christ, and gain education and training on all things church. Finally, at the end of the season, they would be baptized at the Easter Vigil. This time of study, preparation, and learning of all things church was not only for the benefit of the learner, it also protected the faith community during times of religious persecution, when some would try to infiltrate a congregation and expose them to the

Time goes on, and the empires of the world become more friendly toward Christianity. Lent then becomes a time of focusing on the story and particularly the passion - of Jesus. It becomes a time of intentional self-examination and repentance. With this shift, pious Christians adopt annual practices of fasting, attending additional prayer and worship gatherings, and charitable giving.

In that vein, we, too are offering and putting together some resources and ways for you to connect, perhaps, differently or deeper with your faith this season.

First, we are complementing our worship with resources for study in the form of books, devotionals, and video that all go together. We are using (if you haven't already heard) The Way: Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus by author and pastor Adam Hamilton. Our texts and themes in

our weekly worship will be influenced by each chapter of this book. Additionally, we are very much urging you to stay after worship for a short time of discussion and further learning. On Sundays, this will include watching the video that accompanies each chapter. We will also benefit from the additional insights of those who've followed along in the book and/or devotional. But you don't have to be a reader to come and learn more! Gathering together with your churchmates will be itself a powerful experience – and you will have all experienced the video together for a common discussion base.

Secondly, we will be adding worship and programming on Wednesday evenings! This is exciting because we have groups for everyone – all ages! The first thing of the evening will be worship at 6:00. It will be a short, prayerful service where we will encounter the video for the week's chapter together.

Prayer, singing, video, coloring pages – all great for both small wiggly people and larger humans who like to move less.

Also at worship (and this is true on Sunday as well) will be a time for prayer and reflection with a tangible, experiential station to go with it. A prayer wall to tie pieces of cloths, a gem from the baptismal font, a rock to decorate with marker, or beads and string to make a prayer bracelet...these and more will

accompany our worship together.

Following the short worship on Wednesdays, there will be a place for everyone to keep fellowshipping and studying together. Nancy Holley is leading the group for adults, I will be with the confirmation students, and Carrie Payne is providing a time for the young ones.

Also, Lent bags! Pick one up or let the office know you need one delivered. We have put together a Lent-at-home bag with some decorative symbols of the season, a devotional, a candle, and more – all to enhance your devotion or worship practices at home!

I pray that you find lent to be a time of renewal and deepening faith. And I encourage you to take advantage of the things we are doing together here. It's not just about keeping busy or studying hard – but doing these things together, centered around Jesus Christ, unites us in faith, unites us as community, and brings us together in ways that are deeply healing after enduring the past two years the strain of life in pandemic.

Come experience Lent together this year. Deepen in faith, grow in community, and let the Holy Spirit warm, challenge, encourage, push, and move you this season.



the Footsteps of Jesus.


