Reach Out , Share Christ with All

FROM PASTOR CHRIS

Easter morning has come and gone, but the Easter proclamation rings throughout our halls for 50 days after Easter Sunday until Pentecost—the Birthday of the Church. The news of the resurrected Christ emboldens our witness in the world. As the earth around us is bustling with signs of new life, new energy, we have about us a feeling of renewed spirits.

As we sing our Easter proclamation "Christ is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed!" for the days leading up to Pentecost, we remember that God calls us to be that body of the Risen Christ.

As the body of Christ we live in the Easter established rhythm of death and resurrection. In the midst of the darkest places, the most broken areas of life, Christ joins us and accompanies us, moving us toward new and everlasting life—holding that promise before us and staying by our side as we realize it. So it is that when we build and deepen relationships with one another and with our neighbors, we encounter the risen Christ.

We are instruments of the work God is doing in the world – the body of the Risen Christ alive in the world today. God is working by deeply entering the lives of each of us, broken people. And as the body of Christ, we are called to enter also into this work, cultivating life-giving relationships with one another and all those around us.

As we enter those broken places, allowing ourselves to be vulnerable and taking time to learn about one another deeply, we will meet Jesus. He will be there with us, and we will learn about him more as we deepen our relationships with our community and our world.

In our ministries, worship, and life together, how might we more fully embrace the work God is doing among us and through? Where can we more boldly enter into relationship with the Christ who meets us in the other and in our brokenness?

We encounter Christ in those around us, even as we embody his work in our own lives.

I am reminded this season of a quote attributed to Teressa of Avilla:

"Christ has no body now but yours. No hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks compassion on this world. Yours are the feet with which he walks to do good. Yours are the hands through which he blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, yours are the eyes, you are his body. Christ has no body now on earth but yours."

Christ is Risen, He is Risen, Indeed! And you, dear church, are the body of Christ raised up for the world. Let us go out into that world seeking Christ, and continuing his life-giving work.

PROPERTY TEAM

The parsonage was built in the mid 1980's. It has been the home to many pastors and their families over the years. In the past two years it has only been used sporadically. The Vision Board has been in conversation over the past couple of months on how we might use this valuable resource to further our mission of "Reaching Out to Share Christ With All". After exploring a few different options and consulting real estate experts, we have decided to offer it for short term rental. In reaching out, we want to help families or individuals in transition from one housing situation to another.

There has been a lot of work done to physically prepare the house for this opportunity. Most of it regular maintenance and repair that a house well lived in needs. Over 50% of the cost of the work was covered by the generosity of the congregation and friends of the congregation.

A few of those projects include: Replacing the carpeting downstairs and the flooring upstairs. Storm damage repair to the outside A new roof went on last summer Replaced the washer/dryer, water heater and air conditioner Bathroom fixture upgrades Repainting the entire interior In working with real estate and insurance experts, we have created a lease and determined a monthly rental cost. We currently have two parties interested in using the house.

While the house has been there for over 30 years, most of you have probably never been inside. The Vision Board would like to invite you to a

In addition, Cathy Gabrielson has painted her way upstairs. So we can begin cleaning the lower level of the parsonage on Monday May 2. If you can help for an hour or two, call Gaye (608-780-5179) or Mike (608-797-4858) or Rich (608-385-9968) so the door can be opened. We will use the office entrance to the lower level. Buckets, mops, cleaners, rags and paper towels will be supplied.

In addition, we have left rakes outside by the little shed if anyone is inclined to do a little raking around the parish.


