A Light Shining in the Darkness

The first star of the night is always an incredible sight to see. At least for a child it invokes a reaction filled with excitement and wonder. "Look! I see a star!" the same as they do every time, day or night, "Look, I see the moon!" There is something new there, shining at us from up above. It looks important, or interesting, or mysterious. For some this one dot in the sky is captivating. And before long the sky darkens and millions more of them appear, becoming even more captivating.

Jesus' birth was announced with a star shining in the sky over the Bethlehem sky. That star the Magi followed to find him and pay him homage. That star calls to mind the imagery in John's gospel of the light that shines in the darkness which the darkness cannot overcome.

That light of John's gospel is, of course, Jesus. He is the "bright and morning star" the first star of the evening, the last shining in the morning. God shines light into the world through the Son, the Savior, Jesus Christ. He guides us and gives us a place to look when all around us is darkness or we feel lost and alone. His light is unable to be overcome by the darkness.

I love the imagery of a star shining in the sky, but maybe even more poignant is that of a candle. On Christmas Eve, when we hear John's gospel and get ready to sing "Silent Night" we begin with the light from the one candle, the Christ candle. From that one flame that shines in the darkness, all our candle are lit. The room comes alive as it is flooded with the lights of 100 candles. Jesus' light is shared, because that is what he meant to have happen, that is why he came.

It is such an amazing and inspiring idea that God's light is meant to be shared. Jesus doesn't just come to be the light, but he also sends his followers to be lights. He calls and chooses you, claims you at baptism, to be one of his lights in the sky, one of the candles shining the light that first came from him into the world.

Epiphany we look to the star, the star that leads us to the Savior born in Bethlehem. That one shines his light and teaches us about love. That one shows the extent of love in his death and resurrection. And he sends us as helpers, as lights, to the world.

Each of you is a little light which points to the one true light – Jesus Christ – in whom you are baptized, who has saved you, who came as one like you and who knows and loves you beyond what any of us can imagine. His light continues to shine, moving us ahead toward renewed hope, love, peace, and joy.

Walk today as a child of the light. May you experience the light of Christ shining brightly around you this new year, and may Christ shine brightly in your hearts for all to see.

VISION BOARD UPDATES

Amendments to the HCLC Constitution and Bylaws

The purpose of this article is to inform and summarize the HCLC Congregation of amendments to the Model Constitution for Congregations of the ELCA as approved by the 2022 Church-wide Assembly. These changes were endorsed by the Vision Board on November 10, 2022. The next step is to communicate to the congregation at least 30 days prior to the annual meeting in February 2023, where we will seek approval. The significant summarized changes are highlighted below:

- Chapter 4: Statement of Purpose *C4.02. D. Serve in response to God's love to meet human needs, caring for the sick and the aged, advocating dignity, and justice, <u>ADD</u> <u>"and equity</u>" for all people, working for peace and reconciliation among the nations, <u>ADD "caring for the marginalized, embracing and welcoming racially and ethnically diverse populations</u>", and standing <u>ADD</u> <u>"in solidarity</u>" with the poor and powerless <u>ADD</u> <u>"oppressed"</u> and committing itself to their needs. Changed to similar language in Chapter 9: Rostered Minister of Word and Sacrament *C9.03.a.8 and Rostered Minister of Word and Service *C9.23.c.
- *C6.05. A + B under Church Affiliation Delete he or she and replaces with "the bishop and/or the bishop designees". Rationale: Inclusive language.
 Chapter 9 Rostered Minister: *C9.13 + *C9.14 + *C9.31 Delete he or she. Rationale: Inclusive language.
 - C*15.02. Panel of five members (three laypersons and two "ADD: rostered" ministers of Word and Sacrament). Rationale: Change for inclusion of both rosters

3. *C9.05 The provision for termination of the mutual relationship between a minister of Word and Sacrament..... **Delete the words physical and mental**. "When allegations of physical disability or mental incapacity of the pastor.... Similar changes were made to *C9.25. As it relates to the mutual relationship between a Minister of Word and Service.

4. Chapter 10: Congregation Meeting and Chapter 12: Congregation Council (Vision Board)

a. C10.08 This congregation may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for

simultaneous aural communication <u>"ADD: or its equivalent"</u>. Rationale: This change recognizes that there are other means of providing for simultaneous communication, for those with hearing disabilities, for example.

b. Similar language in C12.13 for Vision Board and Committee meetings.

c. <u>ADD</u> <u>C10.09</u>. <u>"Ex officio</u>" <u>as used herein means member-</u> <u>ship with full rights of voice and vote unless otherwise expressly limited</u>. Rationale: Often confusion around the term.

5. C12.05. E. The Congregation Council shall ascertain that the financial affairs of the congregation are being conducted efficiently giving particular attention to the prompt payment of all obligations and to the regular forwarding of mission support monies to the synod treasurer. Rationale: Synods have different systems, this allows for greater flexibility.
