DRAMATIC READING: Matthew 21:1-17 Readers: Narrator, Jesus, Prophet, Crowd, City Folk, Chief Priest

Narrator: When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them,

Jesus: "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately."

Narrator: This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, saying,

Prophet (Pulpit Side): "Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

Narrator: The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them

on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting,

Crowd (Piano Side): "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

Narrator: When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking,

City Folk (Pulpit Side): "Who is this?"

Narrator: The crowds were saying,

Crowd (Piano Side): "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee."

Narrator: Then Jesus entered the temple and drove out all who were selling and buying in the temple, and he overturned the tables of the money changers and the seats of those who sold doves. He said to them,

Jesus: "It is written, 'My house shall be called a house of prayer'; but you are making it a den of robbers."

Narrator: The blind and the lame came to him in the temple, and he cured them. But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the amazing things that he did, and heard the children crying out in the temple, "Hosanna to the Son of David," they became angry and said to him,

Chief Priest (Pulpit Side): "Do you hear what these are saying?"

Narrator: Jesus said to them,

Jesus: "Yes; have you never read, 'Out of the mouths of infants and nursing babies you have prepared praise for yourself'?"

Narrator: He left them, went out of the city to Bethany, and spent the night there.

The Gospel of the Lord! Praise to you, O Christ!

SERMON

REPENTANCE FOR RIPPING THE CHURCH TO PIECES

CONFESSION



PALM SUNDAY

Scene: The hobby horse/strong adult and second toy horse should be set in the doorway of the nave with everyone gathered a little way away. The Owner is standing nearby.

Prophet: Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your ruler is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

(Disciple 1 and Disciple 2 enter, and each takes the 'rein' of one of the donkeys.)

- **Owner:** Hey! Where are you going with my donkeys?
- **Disciple 1:** The Lord has need of them.
- **Disciple 2:** We'll bring 'em back. Promise.
- **Owner:** You mean Jesus? Go right ahead then!

(Disciples 1 and 2 run off to the rear of the gathered congregation)

Narrator: The disciples brought the donkey and colt back to Jesus. They put their cloaks on the donkey's back and Jesus sat on them.


Children line the aisle in preparation for Jesus. Jesus then enters riding. As Jesus approaches, invite all the children to lay their palms into the aisle for the donkey to walk on.

Pave the Way With Branches

- **Narrator**: The crowds gave Jesus a royal welcome as he rode into the city, just like a king. But Jesus was a very different king—he was a king of peace. Not every one understood that. Jesus was not what they were expecting. But the people all shouted:
- All: "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"
- **Narrator**: The people in the city weren't sure what was going on.
- Person 1: Who is this guy? Why is everyone cheering?
- Person 2: This is Jesus! God's King! He has come to save us!
- All: Hosanna! Hosanna! Hosanna!
