

Reach Out , Share Christ with All FROM PASTOR CHRIS

Being that it's November, if you haven't already thought of Thanksgiving, you probably will soon.

There's a connection between thankfulness and generosity, thankfulness and giving. Did you know that it is actually physically beneficial to the giver to give? Studies have shown that when we do something nice for someone else, particularly if it was a spur-of-the-moment thing, our body reacts by sending out chemicals in our brain that cause us to feel good (dopamine, serotonin, and endorphins for those of you who know what those are). It's actually the same chemicals that cause a "runner's high", that feeling of happiness and strength after running for a pretty good distance. Having that runner's high, or giver's high in this case, is good for all kinds of things from mood to immune support, and can help you heal faster from injuries, or naturally ease pain.

So, maybe if you don't run or exercise vigorously all that often, you can support your health (and that of others) by being kind and generous!

For us as followers of Christ, the practice of giving is also good because there is a very small line between having things and idolizing things. There is a good reason that the Ten Commandments start with God being God, and us having no other gods. We tend to put a lot of value on things that provide us with wealth, security, power - things outside God that give us a sense of value and worth if we have it. Martin Luther talks about how we are built to worship something - we just are. If

someone were to look at you, see how you lived your life, what would they suppose was most important to you? Luther says, that shows you what your god is, it shows you the thing you worship.

Giving, for us as faithful people, does have a lot to do with sharing our resources for the greater good and for the furthering of Jesus' mission among us. But as a spiritual practice, it also fights against our inclination to worship things other than God. As I said, there's a small line between having things and idolizing things. Each time we give we make that line just a little bigger.

By practicing kindness and generosity, we are putting our relationship with others and with God above our relationships with stuff. When that happens, we are able to be more thankful and realize what blessings and gifts we have from God.

Thanksgiving gives us a moment to pause and reflect on what is most important in our lives. It helps us reframe the relationship we have with others, with ourselves, and with our stuff into more life-giving relationships. It reminds us that kindness and generosity have a foundational place in our lives.

God's kindness and generosity toward us know no bounds. That very fact is how we even have the gift of life in the first place. All the blessings we have in life are first from God, and all eventually go right back to God. How we use what we have been given is a product of our baptism and call in Christ.

Do something good for yourself and others today. Show kindness. Be generous. It's good for you, for others, and it tells the love of Jesus. But best of all, it's a lot easier than running a marathon.

HALFWAY CREEK LUTHERAN CHURCH VISION BOARD MEETING MINUTES October 1, 2023

ALL MEMBERS **Present**: Pastor Chris Sesvold, Gaye Johnson, Amy Noel, Mike Martin, Kari Washburn, Diane Jostad, Patti Happel, Andrea Baxter

Call to Order @ 6:00

Devotion: Gaye shared devotion from "Christ in Our Home".

Approval of the Agenda: Kari made motion to approve revised agenda. Amy 2nd, motion passed.

Actions since the last meeting: Kari made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 14, 2023 VB meeting, Andrea 2nd. Motion passed on September 27, 2023.

Recommendation that we set up a separate meeting to discuss just vision, using the document that Pastor shared with us at the September 14th meeting. Gaye will set up date and communicate to the VB.

Pastor's Report

- 1. 17 kids in confirmation with a lot of energy. Several activities planned for the next several months. Each VB member took 3-4 names and will regularly touch base with a confirmant.
- 2. Sunday School off to a great start. Gave out Bibles last week. 13 kids attended this week. We have a new curriculum this year that we are adjusting to.

Discussion: Andrea asked if we can get a new table and chair set more appropriately sized to kids. **Action**: Will use dedicated funds for Sunday School and Children and Youth.

Financial Report

- 1. September Report not yet available. Mike will ask Jodie to send to all VB members when it is available.
- 2. Covering operating cost variance: Through the course of the year, we have taken \$10,000 out of our Thrivent accounts, leaving a balance of ?\$28,000 at the end of August. We have also borrowed \$7862.06 from Dedicated funds. This money will need to be paid back.
- 3. VB members appreciated meeting with Jodie after the September VB mtg to better understand the budget and where we are at financially. Several ideas were generated.

- 4. **Next Step** in addressing operating budget shortfall. Current measures (Thrivent funds, borrowing from Dedicated funds, expense reduction) is not a long term solution in meeting our expenses. **ACTION**: Plan in place to have a communication out to the congregation by November 1, 2023. VB will make themselves available between and after services that first couple of weeks of November to answer questions. Will consider a short temple talk or announcement at each of the four services during those weeks.
- 5. Gaye will set up a separate meeting in November to begin work on 2024 budget.

Property Team

- 1. New contract with Schumacher Elevator out of La Crosse for elevator preventive maintenance, diagnostics and yearly certifications. Cost is 1/2 of previous contract with Schindler and better plan for service. Thanks Mike for all your work and due diligence on this issue over the past year and a half.
- 2. Mike will follow-up with Raymond Lee to confirm date for lift for tree and gutter clean up. We will communicate to the congregation the need to help on that day.

New/Other Business:

Discipleship - Cultivating Relationships:

- 1. Shari Ireland and Jodi Anderson to host a weekend scrapbooking event on October 13 and 14th.
- 2. Enjoyed reading the bio on the new family that has moved into the parsonage that was in the October newsletter.

Next meeting November 9, 2023 @ 6pm. Special meetings will be scheduled for Visioning and Budget.

Patti made motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:50pm. Diane 2nd, motion passed.


Confirmation students had
