

Reach Out , Share Christ with All FROM PASTOR CHRIS

Isaiah 40:6-8 (The Message translation)

A voice says, "Shout!" I said, "What shall I shout?"

"These people are nothing but grass, their love fragile as wildflowers. The grass withers, the wildflowers fade, if God so much as puffs on them. Aren't these people just so much grass? True, the grass withers and the wildflowers fade, but our God's Word stands firm and forever."

We read Isaiah a lot as we approach Christmastime. This particular passage we will hear on the 2nd Sunday of Advent, December 10. The message and imagery this prophet used sings beautifully and captures the promise that we realize as God's love come to us in Jesus.

Christmas is often about sharing love and celebrating goodwill to all humankind. That's one of the beautiful pieces of the season. But this text from Isaiah captures also the reality that our love and goodwill toward others is as fragile as all else in our lives. One puff and the flower fades, the grass withers.

The good news is that it's not all up to us. God's Word stands firm, God's love persists. Hopefully you will do something loving this season, something charitable, kind or good. Thank you, because the world needs one more act of compassion, one more listening ear, one more seemingly random act of kindness thrown out into it. And that matters. So much, that matters. That one thing from you, and one thing from someone else Jesus takes and uses in ways that we cannot count or imagine.

And when we misstep, when we fail to act with love, Jesus uses his light shining in the siblings around us to comfort and guide us forward.

The next time you find yourself feeling wilted or fading, the joyful spirit waning from the weight or exhaustion of this season, or just life, or everything going on around the world... know that God is and always will be in control. Know that more good is coming, because God's Word and God's love stands firm forever. Remember that even the smallest of steps, the tiniest of kindnesses from you makes God smile and Jesus uses for extraordinary things.

It is Jesus who makes the season bright. It is Jesus who brings good news to the world – who lifts up the lowly, who topples the proud, who makes bountiful the plates of the hungry, and moves us all to share (Luke 1:51-53).

God is here. Let us celebrate the love of God in Jesus Christ together this Christmas, let us come to the table and be fed by the one who is God's Word and will stand forever. And may you be strengthened to share God's love, peace, and goodwill in many ways this Christmas.

Hope, Peace, Love, and Joy be yours in Christ!

Kari made a motion to approve the minutes of the October 19, 2023 VB Special meeting, Patti 2nd. Motion passed.

Patti made a motion to allow the Union Mills 4H to use the Heritage Hall for their meetings. Kari 2nd. Motion passed.

Action since last meeting

- 1. Special meeting on November 2, 2023 to begin a visioning process.
- 2. The VB met with Jodi Anderson, Bookkeeper on November 4 to begin the process of creating a budget for 2024.

Finance Team

 Jodi was able to provide an update on both dedicated funds and the current status of or Park Bank and Thrivent accounts. We had reviewed the October financials at the budget meeting on November 4th. Amy made a motion to accept the financial report. Patti 2nd. Motion passed.

- 2. Noisy offering: November's offering will go to LuMin Campus Ministry. December will focus on ELCA "Good Gifts." Amy will write an article for the newsletter to share with and thank the congregation of the impact we have been able to make with our noisy offerings.
- 3. 2024 Budget: Jodi presented a draft of the 2024 budget. Next step: We will present multiple budgets to the congregation. This will include: balanced budget in which expense = income, a minimum budget with no salary increases, a budget that includes 2% increases for staff and minimum guideline increase for pastor and a fourth budget that includes some of our "dreams" for the future. Jodi will send a draft when complete and we will plan to review at the December 14th VB meeting.
- 4. Jodi reviewed the fees r/t Vanco (Simply Giving) and PayPal. Approximately 1/3 of our income comes in regularly through these services.

Pastor's Report

- 1. Large focus on Confirmation and SS programs including music and the Xmas program. Working with a group of youth and adults on planning to attend the National Youth Gathering next summer. "Baptism remembrance" was the focus of the milestone class for SS
- 2. Nursing home worship, community meetings, Fall Theological Conference and planning for Thanksgiving service with the other Holmen pastors were some of the other activities this month.
- 3. Special prayers and support to Beulah Sanders after her son's funeral and Pat Krause and her family through the end of her life.
