FROM PASTOR CHRIS

In January we enter the liturgical season of Epiphany (technically, it's "ordinary time" described as the season after Epiphany... but for simplicity's sake, there you have it). In this season our Bible stories and our reflection center around the ways Jesus is revealed in the world.

Epiphany is a word that means "showing forth," or "revealing." One of the main symbols is that star the wise men followed to find Jesus. We celebrate Jessus being revealed to the world. Jesus is, as the star represents, the light breaking into our world, piercing our darkness, and "the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5).

In 2017 I had the opportunity to tour this little factory that made an Epiphany decoration.

In Germany there is a tiny little town called Herrnhut. The tiniest bit of a little town. It's name means "the Lord's hat" or perhaps something more like "under the Lord's protection."

In this town, for 160+ years, they have been making and distributing the Moravian star. This star has been purchased and adopted by so many, and spread literally across the globe. They were everywhere when I was in Germany, and we have several among our Christmas decorations at home.

The Moravian star recalls the Bethlehem star, that one that brought the wise men to the baby Jesus. It is also a symbol of the light of Christ. The Moravian Stars, being

spread across the world, show a symbol of how the light of Christ gets revealed to people and places all across the globe.

We bought our stars at the little factory where they are still made. They are still put together by hand, glued if they are the paper ones. I counted no more than 9 people working on them when we toured the facility.

The simple sale and distribution of a Christmastime decoration, originally an Epiphany decoration (and likely a geometry project for schoolchildren), continues to remind us of the light of Christ around the world.

That star made known the one who wise men of the east would come, worship, and bring gifts. It points to the one who brings the hope of God's kingdom on earth – a kingdom of everlasting peace, joy, and love.

You, in your own walks of faith, are like those stars. Each day you are given opportunities to share or experience the light of Christ. In your place of work, your family, or your friendships, Jesus shines through you, and to you, and calls you to shine his light and reveal his love to the world.

Walk today as a child of the light. May you experience the light of Christ shining brightly around you this new year, and may Christ shine brightly in your hearts for all to see.

FOUR BUDGETS?

I know what you're thinking, "Am I really getting 4 budgets to look at this year?" Well, yes. Here's what's going on.

The past couple of years our congregation has had to use some of our reserve funds to meet our expenses. And we have no means to replenish these funds.

As we look to the next budget year, we've gotten to the point where we need to fund our mission without reserves. So, these 4 budgets are different pictures of how we operate, all are showing deficit. The vision board has some ideas on how to remedy our financial situation. We could continue as we currently operate, which would deplete our reserve funds. Or we could find ways to increase income, pay for repairs and pay off our debt, perhaps through a capital campaign or by selling property.

Now, rather than hash this all out in one drawn out annual meeting, we want a more inviting avenue. We have set aside a meeting time between services on January 14 to learn what's going on, hear ideas and concerns, and dream together about how we can support our mission and ministry. This will help take pressure off the decision-making of the annual meeting when we officially finish and approve our budget.

So today, two things for you to do:

- Take a look at the numbers. Come to the meeting between services on January 14 to hear more about what is going on and share your thoughts and ideas.
- 2) Think about some ways you like to gather as church, things we can do together that can also support our mission by promoting generosity. Where will God provide opportunities for us to grow in generosity or share Jesus' love in ways that invite financial participation?

Thank you for your dedication, generosity, and most of all: your love of Jesus and living in his name.
